Christ Episcopal Church, Clarksburg and St. Barnabas Chapel, Bridgeport Guidelines for In-person Services

All in-person services will adhere to these guidelines:

1. Wearing a face mask is REQUIRED, unless medically unable to do so, then alternatively, a face shield is required.
2. Hand sanitizer will be available at both entrance and exit locations.
3. Potentially having your forehead temperature taken before entry.
4. Ushers will direct traffic flow and provide instructions and reinforce guidelines.
5. Standing and sitting at least 6 feet from others not in one's household.
6. No administration of Holy Communion at the present time.
7. No choir or congregational singing. Solo singing only.
8. Required reservations for attending services.
9. No attendees aged 7 or younger (unless not mobile).
10. Avoiding crowded hallways.
11. Use of wipes on door handles and other surfaces, especially before and after bathroom use (the church will provide).
12. Possible multiple services on Sunday morning or other day.
13. No prayer books will be provided for use at services.
14. Service bulletins will be provided & must be taken home. Do not leave them at church.
15. If you are sick, or don't feel well...stay home!
16. Any person who has traveled out of state is to avoid attending in-person services for a period of fourteen (14) days after returning home.
