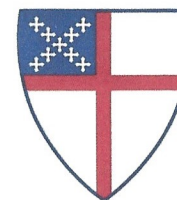

Father Chris' Message

Greetings Church!

Once again, I want to say that it is a joy being your priest. It is exciting to be part of an energetic parish that is eager to be active and to grow! There's been a lot going on in the life of the church through March and April. In May, we will be welcoming Rev. Heather Barta who will help guide the vestry in some planning and goal setting. One of my favorite verses of Scripture is Proverbs 29:18, "Where there is no vision, the people perish. But happy are those who keep God's instruction." Rev. Heather will work with the vestry as we reach out to the church, ask questions, and learn where God is moving in our midst. I truly believe that the Holy Spirit is working in and through Christ Church and St Barnabas Chapel. We see "evidence" all around us! My prayer is that the excitement, enthusiasm, and joy we see will last beyond a season or two and help transform our church in a positive way.

In the following weeks, you might be approached by members of the vestry and by me. We want to hear about how God is at work in your life and where you see God moving at Christ Church/St Barnabas Chapel.

There's an all-too-familiar saying, "if you don't know where you're going, any path will get you there." In the month of May, you have an assignment: *Pray for the church every single day.* We often pray for individual members who are sick, grieving, or in trouble. Yet as Christians, we are also called to pray for the mission and purpose of the church. A few questions might guide you:

Where is God leading us as a church?

What gifts has God given us?

What can we do to reach the people that no other church is reaching?

All we do as the church should be rooted and grounded in prayer. As the vestry begins this important work of goal setting and visioning, your prayers are necessary. As Jesus tells us, "Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). Your gifts of time, talents, and treasures are important for the church; but the single greatest thing you can do is pray! If you're struggling to find the words, here's some guidance that might be helpful:

Ever living God, whose will it is that all should come to you through your Son Jesus Christ: Inspire our witness to him, that all may know the power of his forgiveness and the hope of his resurrection; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.* (*Book of Common Prayer*, "For the Mission of the Church").
