
A Change in Plans

Where Did UTO Money Go in 2023?

In the fall of each year there are UTO Ingathering's throughout the Episcopal Church. Then in the spring of the following year, 100% of the money received in the previous fall is available for grants. The UTO's 2022 Ingathering received \$1,079,600.54 as a result of your gratitude and generosity. In 2023 this money has funded 22 grants. The focus for these grants was "innovative mission and ministry projects addressing all aspects of the worldwide incarceration crisis, specifically: preventative programs and intervention; prisoner support outreach; prison reform work; or post-prison re-entry."

Of the 22 grants in 2023, 8 were for projects in the Episcopal Church, 11 were for projects in the Anglican Communion, and 3 were for continued support of historical grant awards. Examples of projects funded with their descriptions edited to shorten are as follows:

Diocese of Bethlehem - Cyprus House Bakery: Scranton, Pennsylvania, **\$50,000** ... will open a bakery and offer employment to previously incarcerated individuals, Apprentices will learn marketable skills in the baking industry

Diocese of Chicago - St. Leonard's Ministries & St. Andrew's Church: Community Gathering Space, Chicago, Illinois, \$100,000 This project will renovate Saint Andrew's Church, on St. Leonard's Ministries campus, to create a new community space for returning citizens. ... with needed support, dignity, acceptance, and kindness.

Diocese of Maryland - Partner for Success: Elkridge, Maryland, **\$31,408** Partner for Success is a faith-based mentoring program designed to help those who are incarcerated make a smooth transition back into society in the greater Baltimore, Maryland, area. Participants are matched with a mentor and a worship community to establish ... plans ... for successful reentry back into the society.

Diocese of Oklahoma - Diocesan Justice Liaison Project: Tulsa, Oklahoma, **\$50,299** New Hope at Trinity serves vulnerable children of prisoners, and the Diocese of Oklahoma delivers many prison-based programs. A diocesan justice liaison will serve as an effective bridge between programs, encourage additional and new participation, and provide additional support

Diocese of Western New York - Enhancing Human Rights through Clergy Jail Monitoring: Buffalo, New York, **\$37,500** Teams of clergy, of varied faiths, will go into jails in Western New York to observe conditions, hear the stories of incarcerated people, and report findings and recommendations, upholding "the dignity of every human being."
