Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As our Church buildings continue to re-open, I am resending the email below.

ALL (!!!!!) persons, clergy included, **MUST** wear masks while in the building...upon entering. Upon sitting in the pews. Upon reading any words aloud. ALL priests are required to wear their masks from beginning to end.

Any deviation from this creates a strong possibility of the spread of the virus.

Other churches are having this issue, and the common denominator seems to be that they're not all wearing masks, and are not distancing themselves. They are operating as if nothing has happened! Much has happened in the past 3 months.
