CHRIS'S CORNER

A WORD FROM OUR REVEREND.....

Happy New Year! Every new year means that we are walking into the unknown. It's a time where we can let go of past hurts and disappointments, and trust in the goodness of God for our future. So many of us make new year's resolutions. committing to exercise, reading more, or deepening our daily walk with Jesus. Most of us know that many of these resolutions are abandoned or altered significantly by the end of February.

In the year ahead, I am not asking you to take on any specific resolution. I'm not going to ask you to pray more, exercise more, give more, or come to church more regularly. Instead, I will simply remind you of a resolution that Jesus makes to us. Jesus tells us in the Gospel of Matthew, "surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." The resolution that Jesus makes to us is trustworthy and true. No matter what 2024 might hold. Emmanuel. God with us. will be with us the whole year through. Even when we struggle to be faithful to our

commitments and our promises, Christ is always faithful to us. My own challenge to you in 2024 is to trust in the faithfulness of Jesus Christ. No matter what ups and downs we might face, we can trust that Jesus walks alongside us. As Christians, our whole lives are lived in response to that promise. The promise that God took on human flesh and dwelt among us and that God will not forsake or abandon us.

We do not need to rest our hope in our own laid plans, promises, or resolutions. Rather, let us place our hope in what Christ has already done for us. Let us commit ourselves to living our whole lives in response to the truth that God has not abandoned this world, but has come to dwell with us in the person of Jesus Christ. Imagine how differently we would live if we took a moment each day to remember this simple truth. We could surrender our fear, because we know that the one who conquered sin and death itself lives among us. We could surrender our worries, because we can trust Him for our daily

daily bread. We could surrender our anger and our hurts, because we know that we have been forgiven when we did not deserve it. We could surrender our selfishness, because we know that Jesus will supply our every need. This certainly does not guarantee that the future will be smooth sailing. It does mean that our Savior will guide us and lead us through even our darkest valleys.

This does not mean that the year ahead won't be rife with challenges to face, obstacles to overcome, and tasks to be accomplished. Yet we can find joy in knowing that we do not face this journey alone. This is indeed what it means to take the spirit of Christmas with you the whole year through. Finally, let us commit ourselves in the year ahead to the work of Christmas. Hear these words from Howard Thurman, Christian mystic, writer, and mentor of Rev. Martin Luther King Jr: "When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the

shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among others, To make music in the heart."

Parish Life sent out an appeal earlier this month for donations to help fund the reception. The Parish response was overwhelming. The amount donated exceeded the cost of the reception by over \$500. As a result, the Vestry voted to give to Father Chris, a cash purse of \$500 as a gift. I had the pleasure of giving him that gift on behalf of the Vestry and the Parish the night of the reception.

Some parishioners, who may not have had a chance to donate to the reception, have expressed a desire to give Chris an additional gift. Our tradition in these occasions has been to give a gift that the parish priest can you use in his or her ministry. And the Vestry will talk with Chris to get an idea of what may be useful to him going forward.
